When my father was engaging with the enemy in the 1940's she was building airplanes at the Willow Run Airport in Detroit working side by side with 'Rosie the Riveter'. One day while working on the assembly line she received a tap on her shoulder. When she turned to see who it was, the lady introduced herself, "Hello, I am Eleanor Roosevelt and I would like to know how long you are going to work here." My Mother's Patriotic Response was, "Until we win this damn War." After the war, she married my father and raised 6 children. In addition to her own family, she helped raise another 6 kids and family members in Northeast Detroit. She never knew any strangers because once people met her they all became friends. She was as Patriotic as any person could be and always had time to write to me when I was serving my country in the USMC in Vietnam. Her letters always perked me up and gave me good reason to fight for "Freedom." While in a nursing home for the past three years, she sang Patriotic songs to cheer up the residents. Her favorite being "God Bless America". She once sang for the Cadillac Honor Guard and the entire staff on Veterans Day. Just 3 days before she passed she was going through some pain when the nurse was changing a dressing on an infection. The nurse looked at me and asked what she could tell her. I told her to ask her to sing. The nurse did and she automatically started singing "God Bless America". Then the nurse started to sing and she knew every word. I wanted to join but the emotion overwhelmed me. She is survived by 5 children, 8




