I would like to start today by thanking all of the Lions Clubs and Members that shared their thoughts and prayers, phone calls, emails, and card's regarding the passing of my son William E. Bradfield III. It is a difficult and tragic time in any parent's life to lose a child. So on behalf of the Bradfield family I thank all of you for your condolences.

Except for a few hundred dollars, we have spent our share of the \$250,000 grant money from the D.A.D. Defense Against Diabetes Program and serviced hundreds of participants in District 11E1 with their Diabetic needs since 2019. We have done so during the worst Pandemic in our Nation's History. From this day forward we shall continue the D.A.D. Program with individual funding sources from each District. At present we have a little over \$6,000 in our District Funds for Diabetes Services. The total number served statewide is approximately 15,000 people. The State of Michigan was the only Multi-District Grant for \$250,000 in the World during this grant cycle and MD-11 can be proud!



For a number of months I have been developing a certificate of recognition and a special pin for hard working Lions that have served our clubs and our District for many years and in the capacity of many offices. We are calling the award "I Passed the Torch". It will symbolize keeping the legend alive and growing of every Lion when he or she passes their duties on to a younger Lion. This idea will also maintain a level of Retention to keep our clubs

healthy in the future. Please view the beautiful artwork of the pin we have developed and the text in the Certificate thanking the aging Lion for all of his contributions given unselfishly to our Lions' organization. They both instill ongoing pride for the Veteran Lion and the Junior Lion.

2nd VDG Jim Patterson's Message



I spent over 30 years as a high school teacher. I started out my career in 1975 as an auto shop teacher. About ten years later I was fortunate enough to sit down in front of a Radio Shack TRS-80 computer. Remember those? A big ugly gray thing but I became fascinated with it. When placed in front of any machine, a lathe, a mill, whatever, my attitude was always "I can run it." And to my mind a computer was just another machine - a crazy different machine - but just a machine after all. So eventually, I went back to school and earned a computer science degree. I created the computer program at my school and I'm proud to say we were one of the first school districts in Michigan to teach word processing, spreadsheets and all the rest. We also were one of the first to have a network of interconnected computers when that wasn't a thing.

Why am I telling you this? Because I am a prime example of an old dog learning new tricks. There is a joy in learning a new skill that I simply have never gotten over-and I'd like to pass that joy on to you.

The district convention is coming up - April 22nd and 23rd, by the way. Have you registered already? (BTW, Club presidents, have you registered your delegates?) This is the perfect opportunity for you to learn your very own new tricks. On Saturday, the 23rd, I will be offering a workshop on the use of Microsoft Word, Excel and PowerPoint. Given the time constraints, it will only be an introduction. But it will give you enough to start learning on your own. Think of this as finding the on-ramp to the interstate. Once the light turns green you speed up the ramp until you hit full speed.

These three applications form the backbone of nearly all business conducted today. A working knowledge of these three will allow you to communicate better and more professionally with almost anyone. "But wait!" you say, "I don't have those programs on my computer." Not to worry, my Lion friends, I will show you some free and nearly free alternatives that are very similar.

- First, we'll be talking about MS Word. This is probably the most familiar since nearly all of us have typed a document. But do you curse a lot when you add a picture?
- Next, we'll explore that really great presentation software called PowerPoint. I imagine
 everyone has seen a PP presentation but have you ever created one? This is a fun one.

• Finally, we'll slay that mathematical thing, Excel (eeek!) Actually, you can do some really cool things with Excel and never add, subtract, multiply or divide.

I encourage you to bring your laptop and/or an idea for something you'd like/need to produce. Performing actions as I do will help you learn. Having a live project to work on is great motivation for learning. Rediscover the joy of learning a new skill.

White Cane: A History

With White Cane drives coming up in the end of April and May, here is a bit of information to share with the members of your club and community.

Ten years after the White Cane was adopted, a town in Illinois passed the first law giving independence to a blind person using a white cane. The law required drivers to stop when they see a blind person crossing the street.

The White Cane Law expanded from there and grew throughout the United States. Blind persons had their independence in crossing a street safely.

In every state it is a law to stop for a blind person trying to cross a street with a white cane at a crosswalk. However, in some states the law varies a little.

In 1937 Michigan passed The White Cane Law.

October 15, 1964 President Lyndon B. Johnson Introduced a White Cane Safety Day.

In 1966, Maryland passed a White Cane Law.

A visually impaired or blind person with a white cane or a guide dog do have the right of way.

In some states it is illegal for a sighted person to use a white cane.
