I'd like to talk about a touchy subject and that is...Reporting your club's activities through the MyLion app. Uuhhh...friends...we're not doing so hot. We have 39 clubs in our district and of them, twenty-five clubs haven't reported anything in over two years. Ouch! That hurts!

Ok, there are several very good reasons why we're not reporting. They range from a) cranky software to z) my internet service sucks! But, fellow Lions, reporting service is important for a whole bunch of reasons and it is something we all should do. There is a document on the LCI website that details all the benefits of reporting our service. Here's the link:

I encourage you all to read it - there's good stuff in there.

For me though, one of the more important reasons is not immediately obvious. In today's world, catastrophe and calamity seem to grow bigger and more destructive all the time. The cost of recovery is becoming astronomical. It is impossible for one organization or club to generate enough funds to alleviate all the suffering resulting from a major disaster. You're gonna need help! And that help comes from corporate and charitable partners.

The argument is simple: we can't persuade potential partners to donate if we can't demonstrate that we have the ability to impact our community. To quote LCI, "Service reports provide tangible evidence of our global engagement and impact to prospective partners of Lions Clubs International. These relationships strengthen the organization and yield benefits at the local level." In plain English that means reporting our service proves we have our big boy pants on and we know how to get stuff done.

One of my duties as 2nd Vice District Governor is to serve on the District's Global Action Team (GAT). It's a fancy name for a group of your fellow Lions trying to solve problems at the district level. And we've come up with a plan to make it much easier for you to report your service using MyLion.

And the plan is... you don't...we do it for you. Houz DAT for creativity?!?!

Each club President, Secretary and contact person with an email address should have already received an email with a blank form and a short instruction page attached. If email access is an issue, call me or text me. My contact info is in the roster book. I'll send you a copy via "snail mail." Print as many copies as you need and have each service chairperson fill out the paper and pencil form about the project. Then you slap a stamp on it and mail it to us. We have someone who has reliable broadband service and is willing to do the data entry into MyLion for each club.

This eliminates a goodly number of the reasons why service reporting isn't done by the clubs in our district. The only thing I ask is to write plainly - let's not overburden our volunteer with crappy handwriting. Please?

PID Bruce made several points that I have referred to in previous articles that he emphasized during his talk to the convention delegates. Points that I feel need to be evaluated by all our Lions Clubs:

- 1. Are your club members having fun at their meetings? Are your meetings awesome? Do you and your Tail Twister plan exciting meetings that members want to come back to? Does a potential member feel excited about attending one of your meetings and want to come back? Meetings need to be planned not just the same routine each time. A speaker, picnic, a social night, special trip to a location which includes your business meeting, or a special event or activity planned by your Tail Twister (that is his/her job). Make your meetings awesome and retention will be high and new members maybe attracted.
- 2. Are your fundraisers and activities still worthwhile??? Are you doing these activities because you have always done them? When I was District Governor, I visited a club and the President told me she was having trouble getting her members to work their fundraiser. I asked her why they were doing it if there was not any interest on the part of her members. Her answer, "Because we have done it for 30 years". PID Bruce Beck indicated that often members tire of a fundraiser, or it is not profitable any longer. He cited a meeting where the Lions were no longer interested in their activity and that night voted to discontinue it. We need to be constantly reevaluating our activities to see if they are worthwhile and if our members and the community are interested in doing them.


