Hello Lions and congratulations on your elections. I hope all is well and safe. The most recent COVID-19 update is as follows: Michigan, confirmed cases 86,661 and 6,399 deaths. USA, 4,197,233 confirmed cases and 143,471 deaths. Worldwide, 16,117,308 confirmed cases and 645,482 deaths. As of June 29, the LCIF has awarded 47 grants in the USA for a total amount of

\$640,309, including District 11A-2 and disaster relief in Districts 11E-1 and D-2. By order of Governor Whitmer the National Guard has joined forces with the MDHHS to perform free testing (888-535-6136).

We are entering new times that require new changes that are necessary to embrace for the sake of our own safety. The new meeting sites have quickly become Zoom Meetings and classes are now online. We have a Diabetes Personal Approach To Health class meeting right now through August 13th. We also have an October meeting starting October 5th that we are accepting participants for. Classes are held in the convenience of your home with no travel time, no exposure to other people and no costs. If you know someone that has diabetes let them know and contact your club President so he or she can notify his members and we can get them signed up!

LCIF has taken a major step and they have extended all Diabetes Grants for an indefinite amount of time. They are also looking at sitting in on one of our virtual training programs that we developed with MSU in May. Midland Lions ended up canceling its annual Chicken BBQ Fundraiser which was scheduled for August 1. This came after other fundraisers and activities had already been canceled.



Midland Lions Flood Relief Efforts







Midland Lions picked up the final supplies from ACE Hardware and delivered them to Meridian Elementary School, one of the main distribution centers for flood relief. This was the 3rd and final phase of the LCIF \$10,000 grant used by District 11E-1 for flood relief. We spent all the grant funds purchasing needed/requested supplies in three phases during the month of June. The Midland Lions choose to do the flood relief in three phases due to the changing needs over those 30 days. Most of the supplies went to help the village of Sanford.

This phase of supplies focused on First Aid Kits, Band-Aids, PPEs, work gloves, solutions for mold and odor control, duct tape, plastic ware, etc. The needs of the flooded communities has now moved on to the rebuilding phase. The LCIF funds do not allow for purchase of building materials. IPDG Jackie Glazier was available and participated in all the phases of our district's flood relief efforts in Midland County.

As I sit here writing this, we are once again wearing face masks and facing uncertainties and unknowns. This is new territory for all of us. As my mind has wandered lately, I have often thought of a sermon I heard when I was a young adult. Yup, I remember that, but don't ask me where I left my car keys!

The title of the sermon was, "And it came to Pass", based on an often used phrase in the writings of the Christian Faith.

- Flexible payments No clubs will be suspended or cancelled through December 31, 2020 for late payment of dues.
- Charter and entrance fees waiver We have waived all charter and entrance fees from July 1 December 31, 2020.

These measures will help Lions facing financial hardships, and give our clubs hope, encouragement, and an opportunity to start the new Lion year with renewed energy and optimism.
