It was exciting, we had 100% representation from clubs within our zone along with District Governor Jeff Schafer. At this meeting I provided handouts about the Special Olympics Opening Eyes Vision Screening Program which occurs at Central Michigan University, not only in Lions District 11 E-1 but in our Zone and encouraged my Clubs to become more active in this very worthwhile service project. Additional handouts included: a printout of the State and District Programs, Leadership Institute Training at the MacMullen Conference Center in Roscommon, and a list of Acronym descriptions. These handouts can be copied and provided to club members to assist with their better understanding of club functions.

Highlight of the meeting was a presentation by District Governor Jeff about monetary support for Lions to attend training at the Leadership Institute. There are funds available from the District to assist with one third of the admission fees for Lions to attend leadership training on November 7-9, 2025. DG Jeff encouraged clubs to cover one third, and the attending Lion the remaining amount or if the club has funds available to pay all the remaining amount. This support would be in the form of a reimbursement as it would take time to process the check.

In addition, DG Jeff provided a short talk on the District and Club Community Impact Grants (DCG) which are available through Lions Club International Foundation (LCIF). He explained that when clubs donate to LCIF, they should choose the "Empowering Service Fund" for the area of giving. This fund covers both the "disaster relief fund" area of giving along with all the other areas that LCIF provides relief. In addition, when clubs give to the "Empowering Service Fund" it allows eligible clubs and districts to utilize some of their donations to LCIF to apply for a grant to support local humanitarian projects. Our district has earned additional credits during the 2024-25 fiscal year, and our balance is \$5,014.23. He stated that more information on how to apply for these grants will be coming out in the September 2025 District newsletter in addition to an email will be sent to Club Presidents.

During the meal break our Zone's past chairperson Diane Fleming reported on a Service Project that occurred at the August Council of Governor's meeting at the Comfort Inn in Mt. Pleasant. For that meeting a request had went out to obtain clothing and personal items for the Mt. Pleasant R.I.S.E. Advocacy, Inc. which deals with domestic violence and sexual assault. When she had gone to pick up the items she was overwhelmed by the response that had come in from all over the State. Diane went on to say that it took 3 trucks and a car eight trips to move the items to the R.I.S.E. storage facility. What a statement of how Lions care about helping other people.

Once the meeting officially resumed the clubs provided a description of their unique Service and/or Fund-Raising Projects. More on these in latter newsletters.

District and Club Community Impact Grant Program

District and Club Community Impact Grants (DCG) empower Lions to support humanitarian activities in their communities. Funded by contributions from clubs and districts to LCIF, these grants incentivize Lions' donations and service projects that align with the foundation's key areas of focus. Under the program, 15% of qualifying unrestricted donations are set aside for DCGs, with all projects requiring LCIF approval. This initiative is available to both districts and clubs. Only donations to the Empowering Service Fund are eligible for DCG funding.

DCG Grant examples include supporting humanitarian projects that enhance community welfare and showcase Lions' impact; Fund health initiatives, such as wellness programs; and develop community engagement activities that foster collaboration between Lions and local organizations. DCG funds can be used to support specific humanitarian activities and highlight Lions in communities they serve. Grant funds are not eligible to pay membership dues or establish a reserve fund. The District and Club Community Impact Grant program is a new program, and though possible scenarios have been anticipated, LCIF may update criteria as additional scenarios are proposed.

Grant applicants must submit their proposal using the LCIF District and Club Community Impact Grant application form. Applications should be submitted to LCIF at minimum 90 days prior to project commencement to allow adequate processing time.

Projects receiving DCG funding shall be clearly identified as being made possible by Lions and LCIF through appropriate recognition, signs, and public relations activities. Upon project completion, grant recipients are responsible for submission of a report detailing project results and use of DCG grant funds. Projects should be completed within one (1) year of approval by LCIF.

For the current Lion Year (2025-2026) District 11-E1 has \$5,014.23 in their DCG grant fund. To learn more about this new grant program attend the upcoming Fall Conference scheduled on Saturday, September 27 at the Luther Lions Hall.

Cabinet Meeting Service Project: Collect Teacher Supplies for three Teachers

Thank you for making our District 11-E1 August Cabinet meeting service project a great success by donating supplies needed in the classroom. One teacher told me their budget for their classroom was \$100 for the year. Almost all teachers end up buying way more than this for their needed classroom supplies. Each teacher submitted a wish list and District 11-E1 Lions responded generously. Thank you to each Lion and Lions Clubs who gave generously!

Photos show the cabinet meeting attendees posing with the collected supplies and then the three additional photos are the teachers when they received their supplies. Two first grade teachers, one from White Cloud Public Schools, Stephanie Karns and one from Beal City Public Schools, Karen Zileski as well as a high school teacher from Beal City High School, Joe Clark were contacted. Our contributions reached close to 170 kids because the high school teacher alone sees 120 students each school day.

For those clubs who participated, the next step is to log this service project in the Lions Portal as a club service project. Any member can make the report, but it takes a club secretary, president or club service chair to complete the report. I will be glad to do this if any of you cannot. The place is a check box shown with the photo that shows a report example and a cursor in the upper right corner that points to 'Report Complete'. This box needs to be checked to complete and make the report official.

Please call me or District Administrator Peggy Frank or DG Jeff who both have trained me. Any of us three will be glad to help you and you are not alone if you find this difficult the first time.

Exciting Sneak Peak District 11-E1 District Convention Service Project

District 11-E1 is going to have two exciting service projects to choose from at our District Convention. The first one is a Bed Build at Sleep In Heavenly Peace, Lake City on Friday afternoon and also Blanket Tying for Sleep In Heavenly Peace at our convention location, the Evergreen Resort, during the same Friday timeslot for anyone that would like to participate. We also will do blanket tying Friday evening for those arriving later.

Sleep In Heavenly Peace, 1551 S. Money Rd., Lake City Mi has a wood shop that will accommodate a maximum of 50 Lions and family who want to participate. All the wood will be cut ahead of time so we will do all the fabrication of bed sections and finish the wood, including staining, so the beds will be ready for delivery when we are done.



We also need to pay for the materials to make the wood beds and Sleep In Heavenly Peace donors will cover the bedding cost for the beds. We are looking for 15 Lions or Lion Clubs in our District 11-E1 who will sponsor a bed for \$250. From our August cabinet meeting we received three bed sponsors: Audible Hearing – Lions Peggy and Mark Frank, Lion Chuck and Barb Dinsmore, and Lions Steve and Brenda Adsmond. For Lions who would like to be involved in this project with a smaller donation, we are also needing blanket sponsors for \$24 each, for a total of 15 blankets.

We will sign up for participation on a first-come basis. EADER DOGSLeader Dogs for the Blind Chairperson: Lion Ken Theobald (Big Rapids Lions Club)

I would like to highlight two things for Leader Dog this month. Recently Leader Dogs hosted 122 of the Lions District First Vice District Governors in Rochester. This was a wonderful three-day event with blindfold walks to experience what it is like to use a guide dog as well as blindfolded white cane opportunities. They also held a Dinner in the Dark event. Overall, it was a fantastic opportunity for these Lions to gain a better insight of what it is like to require the services provided by Leader Dogs for the Blind.

They also have two Lion advocates that currently have guide dogs speak. Lion Joey Johnson and Lion Walker Jones. You will truly be amazed if you take a minute to check these two guys out on Facebook or Instagram.

The second item to highlight is an upcoming fundraiser event for Leader Dogs for the Blind. Ferris State University and the Michigan College of Optometry is hosting their annual fundraiser for Leader Dogs for the Blind on October 17, 2025. There is a chance that FSU might be able to provide a matching grant for the money raised at this event. We are still working out the details. If your club makes an annual donation to Leader Dogs, please consider presenting your check at this event to qualify for this potential match. Your support could have twice the impact. If you would like to participate in this event but are unable to attend, please contact Lion Ken Theobald at (231) 387-3622. Last year District 11-0E1 gave a total of \$22,277 to Leader Dog and all of MD-11 (Lions of Michigan) gave a total of \$433,844.





Lions Bear Lake Camp September News Steve Glazier District 11E1 Chairperson

Lions Bear Lake Camp is owned and operated by Lions as a 501C-3 Non-Profit Corporation. The Camp opened its doors in July, 2000, starting with only 53 campers our first year, we have since been able to service more than 10,000 campers and visitors. We are financially supported by the Lions, and Leos, as well as Foundation grants and individual donors throughout Michigan. Lions Bear Lake Camp's Mission is to develop leadership skills, build confidence, and to provide premier outdoor educational and recreational experiences year-round to all persons, regardless of ability.

Hi Fellow Lions

Bear Lake kids camp is extremely busy this summer with the influx of additional Camp attendees this year so Camp updates have been limited. Two years ago, they had 785 kids attending camp, last year they had 1079 kids and this summer they are projecting 1500 kids over 11 weeks compared to traditional 8 weeks previously. Through the end of July, they had about 1000 kids attending so far this year.

Before you start thinking WOW! We're going to need to schedule a couple more pancake breakfasts, pasty, BBQ's or fish dinners to help cover that number of kids. To clarify not all attending 1500 kids though are financially supported by Lions. Only Visually impaired and Hard of Hearing camps are funded by Lions at a nominal cost of \$40 per camper with Lions picking up the balance per camper. The "majority" of the Kids Summer Camp attendees "are not" sponsored or financially supported by Lions such as Autism, Foster Care, Grievance Loss, Cancer, and many others. These are typically contracted to other groups and organizations at negotiated rates based on a variety of factors and needs. Usually, these camps do not require as many Bear Lake Camp staff members as they often bring their own counselors, chaperons, nurses, coordinators and other required supporting assistance.

But remember, it is costly to run a camp year-round, and our donations help the Bear Lake facility replace aging equipment, improve safety measures and ensure that the facilities remain welcoming for all and again most importantly "help support, fund and make affordable Summer Camp for Visually Impaired and Hard of Hearing kids". So please, consider this when budgeting your District 11E1 donations.

I want to emphasize the overwhelming interest from kids who want to attend this camp which speaks volumes of the quality of the programs offered and the professionalism of the staff administering them.

Several Lion Clubs and individuals have volunteered their time to assist at different times during this busy Kids Summer Camp including, Andrea daughter of "Big Al Kassin," who was instrumental in founding Bear Lake Camp in 1982. I've had the opportunity to meet and work on camp projects with Andrea and listen to her stories of growing up at the camp as a very small child when it wasn't landscaped and was comprised of tall weeds, trees, shrubs and only a couple older buildings. Al convinced a military base (likely Camp Grayling Military base as Andrea only remembered it was military) to help move dirt, build roads and assist in developing the property grounds to what it is today

A big 'Thank You" to Lapeer County Community Foundation for their incredible \$10,000 grant in support of camperships and programming at lions bear lake camp. This gift reaches far beyond dollars, it opens doors for children to discover new abilities, make lasting friendships, and create memories they will carry for a lifetime. Grants like this make it possible for us to welcome every camper who dreams of being at Bear Lake Camp regardless of their circumstances.




