Sid L. Scruggs III, of Vass, North Carolina, USA, was elected president of The International Association of Lions Clubs at the association's 93rd International Convention, held in Sydney, Australia, June 28-July 2, 2010. Past President Scruggs is a retired military and commercial airline pilot and a graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy.

Using as his presidential theme A Beacon of Hope, Past President Scruggs made service to others – the core principle of Lions clubs around the world – the focal point of his presidency.



A member of the Vass Lions Club, he has held many offices in the association. In addition he has presented at the USA/Canada and Europa Leadership forums and served as an instructor for the Lions Clubs International Leadership Institute and the District Governors-elect School.

In addition to his Lions activities, Past President Scruggs served many years as chairperson of the board of directors of the North Carolina Governor Morehead School for the Blind. He is also a life member of the American Airlines Grey Eagles Association & the Naval Academy Alumni Association.

He has been presented with the Order of the Long Leaf Pine, the highest award given by the State of North Carolina, by the Governor of North Carolina. He is a member of the North Carolina Lions Hall of Fame and in 2010 he was elected to the United States Blind Golf Association Hall of Fame. He has received an honorary doctorate of humanities from World University.

In recognition of his service to the association, Past President Scruggs has received numerous awards including the Key of Nations Award for sponsoring more than 100 Lions members, and the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor the association gives to its members. He is a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow.

Past President Scruggs and his wife, Judy, also a Lion and a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow, have four children and 16 grandchildren.





I'd like to take a moment to introduce Future Leader Dog Baker, the newest member of the 11-E1 Leader Dog Team. Karen and I picked up Baker on December 21st, just in time for Christmas. Baker is a female Golden Retriever/Labrador Retriever cross and she is our 13th puppy hence the name Baker as in Baker's Dozen.

For those who are not familiar with the responsibilities of a Leader Dog Puppy Raiser. They are volunteers who take puppies into their homes and provide them with health care, food and life experiences. They get to name the puppies, teach them house manners, basic obedience and expose them to the world. Positive reinforcement training techniques are utilized though out Leader Dog and it all starts with the Puppy Raiser.



Leader Dog provides training and guidance for Puppy raisers. Raisers are encouraged to attend bi-monthly training weekends at the campus in Rochester, MI to help develop their dog handling skills. Baker, Karen and I just completed the most recent session in January. We attend these frequently because we feel you can always pick up something new.



There are roughly 400 raisers in 22 states and Canada. Leader Dog has a network of volunteer Puppy Counselors to help these raisers with any difficulties they be having throughout the year. Puppy counselors arrange monthly events in a variety of settings and provide tips on care, training and manners. Karen and I recently have assumed the role of counselor for the Midland, Bay City and Saginaw region. It's a wonderful honor to be given that opportunity and we have a great group of dedicated raisers.

Leader Dog also provides a weekly progress timeline for the first 16 weeks of the puppy's life to help the raiser make sure they are on track. Currently Baker is in Week 12 and she is working on calmly meeting and greeting people so she will be a good ambassador at this year's convention.in March.

Baker will likely be attending many of the 2014 Lion's functions with me. As Lions you can assist me in her training by treating her just as you would treat a working guide dog and please ask before you attempt to pet her. Also please don't be offended if we decline you at times. It is just part of her training.

Raising Leader Dog Puppies is one way Karen and I have found to make a difference, providing someone with the independence and mobility that was taken away by blindness. As Lions we make a difference by serving our community and by providing organizations such as Leader Dog with our fundraising dollars. Let's continue to work together to show people how "We Serve".
