DG AL ROESELER'S FEBRUARY MESSAGE

Hard to imagine that we are more than half way done with the Lions year. Time does travel very fast! As I reported to the recent Cabinet Meeting, our district has had a very productive year so far. Accomplishments include:

- Over 5,000 pair of eyeglasses were shipped to Merida Mexico in preparation for our District's first mission trip. Many Lions in numerous clubs were involved in donating, washing, reading prescriptions, and entering data into a computer program in preparation for the trip.
- Baldwin Lions wrote a successful \$10,000 disaster relief grant to LCIF to help provide food to people in their county after tornadoes caused lengthy power outages resulting in the loss of much refrigerated and frozen food.
- Our Kidsight program screened 1,849 children
- Our district provided the leadership and expertise for Multi District 11 to write a successful \$250,000 grant to LCIF to continue our work with Diabetes detection and management.
- We collected over \$25,000 from district clubs at our Fall Conference to support Lions' causes.
- Many Lions Clubs in our District "help to make the season bright". Hundreds of free meals are provided to community members on Thanksgiving and Christmas. Hundreds more families are given food, clothing and presents by Lions clubs.
- Seven Lions Leaders were trained at the fall Higgins Lake Leadership conference, and for the first time we had a Lion trained at the LCI Emerging Lions Leaders Institute in Chicago.
- Local clubs raised many thousands of dollars for projects in their communities, and Lions charities. Hundreds of local service projects were conducted.

All in all, Lions in District 11-E1 are doing an outstanding job! The only major cloud on our horizon is declining membership. District support is available through our GMT, contact PDG Ron Gibson for information. I would suggest that we work on two areas. The first is retention. Make sure your club is a warm, inclusive club that values the input of all members, especially if they suggest things that are new and different. People leave Lions for a number of legitimate reasons, let us not allow feeling unappreciated be one of them. In approaching potential members, rather than asking them simply to join Lions, perhaps ask what they see as community needs. Then suggest that by working through and with the Lions great things can happen. This might also result in adding to our service projects. What a great result for an organization whose motto is "We Serve". DG Al

D.A.D. STATE PROGRAM RECIEVES LCIF GRANT

On Friday January 11, 2019, our MD 11 & SD 10 Districts received official notification from Lions Clubs International Foundation's Board of Trustees that they had approved the LCIF Diabetes Grant for the "Defense against Diabetes" (D.A.D.) Project in the amount of \$187,509 over a one-year project period. All eleven Districts of Lions of Michigan had committed to pursuing the new LCIF Diabetes Grant and have raised funds equal to \$62,500. The Districts will now receive matching funds of \$187,500 to equal the total of \$250,000. These funds will be disbursed proportionally to each District. Each District has raised as much as \$5,681 and will be receiving matching funds of \$17,045 to equals \$22,726 per district. We now have a major task ahead of us as a Lions of Michigan team.



January was designated as "Hunger Awareness" month by LCI. The Midland Lions participated by buying a truckload of food and helping community members distribute it to 199 families.

Please note that if any Lions member passes after the cutoff date of April 1, 2019, you have the choice this year of getting that member added to the Memorial Program this year right up until the convention or you may wait to have that member honored at the 2020 convention. The following excerpt is a sample of the material from the Life of a Lion (it is summarized):

Florida is on Vickie and Brian's winter plans. They arrived at Panama City, FL several months after the hurricane had hit the city. They stopped to eat and were told about the devastation in the city that still existed after several months. They found homes, businesses, trees, etc. badly damaged and exposed to the elements. They saw a building spray painted with "850 Strong – look us up". It was about people putting the city back together and the need for help. Christmas was coming and the need for gifts for children existed. Salvage Santa who had fixed toys and bikes for kids for years, needed help. The two Lions volunteered. The news got out Santa did not have enough toys and bikes for these hurricane ravaged children for Christmas. Mike Rowe from "Returning The Favor" donated 100's of bikes, Good Morning America gave \$50,000 in toys. The Lions and community members spent two days distributing these items to parents for their children. Many parents waited patiently in the rain for these gifts (pictured at the top of the story). The life of a Lion takes on many different situations and callings. We are proud to be Lions!
