Applications are available through your Foundation trustees, PDG Pam Schroeder or PDG Pete Conarty or through the Michigan Lions Foundation. Applications and a biographical form need to be filled out and submitted to the District Cabinet for their endorsement. Nominations will be accepted at the Foundation no later than March 1, 2020.

# Club News

#### **Luther Lions**

We have had another successful "Feeding America" distribution on January 16th. More than 109 households served, translating into 272 people. Our monthly dinner was on January 22. The Soup Supper consisted of four homemade soups, all you can eat, with beverage and dessert for a donation. Proceeds benefit our scholarship fund for Pine River High School graduates. All in all we did well with collecting \$450.00.

#### **Fremont Lions**



Students In Need of Eyecare (SINE) Project-Hesperia The Michigan College of Optometry at Ferris State University partnered with the Fremont Lions Club to provide an eye care program for students in the Fremont and Hesperia Public Schools. The program, Students In Need of Eyecare or SINE, was made possible through a unique partnership with the City of Fremont with their agreeing to act as the fiduciary agent. This made the program eligible for a grant from the Fremont Area Community Foundation. With a grant of \$22,000 the program was designed to service 60 participants. Students were referred to the SINE program by a teacher, administrator, support staff, or parent/quardian. Since more students were referred than the program could handle, a selection process based on access to, and history of previous eye care, and the severity of potential eye problems occurred. The need was so great that 14 additional students were selected with the university agreeing to absorb the cost of the extra exams. On December 5, 2019, during regular school hours, 74 students were transported to the Ferris State University for a comprehensive eye exam and a tour of the university. Parents were encouraged to attend along with their student. Of the students examined, 5 were advised to seek additional evaluation if their symptoms persist, 23 were recommended for further testing, and 58 were found to be in need of prescription glasses. The glasses were delivered and fitted to the students on Friday, January 10, 2020. It was a day of joy and celebration with excited students seeing the world in a new way.

#### White Cloud Lions

On Christmas Day, White Cloud Lions partnered with <u>Sharing Christmas</u>. (A local group of volunteers whose mission is nobody spends Christmas alone.) Over 650 Christmas dinners were served and close to 200 meals were delivered to home bound community people.

On December 6, we hosted a 'Friends of the Library' fundraiser with a Swiss Steak dinner and Tree Auction to raise funds for the local library totaling \$1,700. At our annual Christmas toy auction we collected 3 boxes of toys for local children. We also collected several large boxes of food for our local pantry.

Again this year, at the Midland Ice Arena, the Midland Lions along with the Midland County Emergency Food Pantry Network, hosted a Mobile Food Pantry on January 23, 2020. The MFP provided a grocery cart full of many essential food items for 258 families (7?? People). numbers of families served was up from last year. Families are in

need when finances are short due to high energy

We were able to start the food distribution earlier than in past years. The Midland Lions paid for the whole truck of food.

#### Leader Dogs for the Blind

When I got my first Leader dog she was from a donated litter. Several years after that, the Puppy Department achieved one of their goals. They had enough female and male dogs in their breed stock program that they no longer needed to accept donation dogs. Now the program is working great. This year they have more puppies than they have raisers to take them.

The "job" of puppy raisers requires taking a puppy from the time it is 8 weeks old until its first birthday. During that year the puppy raiser needs to teach the puppy basic obedience and expose it to many situations around people.
