Lions have survived for 102 years because we understand the necessity of change and not only do we accept positive changes but we embrace change when it improves our communities and what it is we are trying to accomplish.


I have enjoyed my past working relationships with the clubs that I served as a Zone Chair, my success with fund raisers that harnessed thousands of dollars for Kidsight, Bear Lake Camp, Diabetes and all of our club fundraisers and I will continue to assist with all District Projects. As your elected leaders we would all like to accomplish as much as possible. As leaders working alone it won't happen. As leaders working with other leaders, and every member in our clubs, zones, District and our State we can and will accomplish so much more "Together We Do It Better" The sharing of ideas will help us all become more successful and progressive.

We have a great and very supportive State and International Foundation that we need to work closer with. Since 2017 we received thousands of dollars for cameras for Kidsight and 2 grants in an 18 month period from June 2017 to January 2019 for Diabetes that amounted to \$295,000.00! We need to continue to support their efforts. It needs to be said how supportive the International is and how supportive we should be of their efforts as well. You should know that 100% of our donations to Campaign 100 goes to the following programs: Today 253M individuals are blind or visually impairedyour \$100 donation funds 2 cataract surgeries. Today 2/3 of children report being the victim of bullying-your \$100 donation provides Lions Quest learning curriculum to an entire classroom for one year. Each year our planet experiences a 15% increase in natural disasters-your \$100 donation provides immediate relief to 4 people in the wake of a natural disaster (Baldwin Michigan 2018). Every day 245 people die from measles-your \$100 donation provides vaccinations to 100 kids. By 2040 650M people will suffer with diabetes and 5M die annually-your \$100 donation provides screenings for 18 individuals. Every 2 minutes a child is diagnosed with Cancer-your \$100 donation can diagnose or treat 8 children. Each night 800M people go to bed hungry-your \$100 donation feeds 14 disabled, low income or homeless people. By 2025, half of the world's population will be living in water stressed areas-Your donation of \$100 provides 14 people with access to clean water.

Increased membership is also of utmost importance. Two years ago 2 non-Lions attended our meetings in Cadillac to learn what we are all about, today Sam is our President and Marcia is our Secretary. It works, try it. I will look forward to my tenure as one of your officers, and I will be honored to work as hard as I can for 11E1.

Brief story on the Lioness pictured above with 2ndVDG Bill: Her name is Lion Leona. A collection of taxidermy animals were given to me and I raised \$15,000 with an online auction. \$4,500 of the auction money was allocated to the Districts Kid Sight Program, \$300 to the 2018 convention and \$500 to Bear Lake Camp. Another \$670 went to DAD lapel pins and approximately \$5,000 is left for future Diabetes programs. At the 2018 State convention we decided to donate Lion Leona to the State DAD Program as our mascot and she is being held hostage at the Harrison Lions Club (Zoo). Lion Jerry Brandt feeds her Purina Cat Chow every day and he is Leona's Lion Tamer! We introduced Leona to President Gudrun and made her an honorary member of DAD.


