

What is Campaign 100?

How can I help as a Lion?

Campaign 100 provides options for individual Lions to make pledges. These can be provided as a one-time donation, or broken up into annual or even monthly contribution. Pledge cards will be provided to your club in the coming months through your club's LCIF coordinator.

How can our club help support Campaign 100?

As with the variety of options given to individual Lions, Clubs can also pledge support in a variety of ways. It is important to note that all individual Lion donations/pledges within a club are credited to the club's total as well. One of the benchmark goals a club can join is to set a goal of raising enough funds that would equal to the same as if every club member gave \$750 per member. Achieving this benchmark would allow the club to be recognized by LCIF as a Model Club. These funds can be raised through fundraising efforts, individual pledges/donations or through seeking donations from community partners or non-Lions. There are so many options available. More information on these options will be available in the coming months.



BIG RAPIDS LIONS HOLIDAY ACTIVITIES

As part of its outreach to help the youth of the community, the Big Rapids Lions Club provides dictionaries to all of the 3rd grade students in Big Rapids. This year the Lions handed out 210 dictionaries in 10 classrooms including Riverview Elementary, Brookside Elementary, Cross Roads Academy, St. Peter's, St. Mary and Big Jackson. Teachers throughout the schools indicated they use the dictionaries in their classroom activities and truly appreciate having them for all of their students.

Each year, the Big Rapids Lions Club holds a special Christmas dinner where they entertain spouses and honored guests. Once again this year, the Club decided to reach out beyond the community and spread some Christmas cheer. Club member Chad Saxton who works at Eagle Village arranged for 12 students and three staff members to join the Club for dinner. Club members took the names of the students, purchased gifts and each student received a Christmas package. Santa Claus made an appearance to hand out the gifts.
