But in order to achieve these objectives, we need leadership. Fortunately for us, leadership training and leadership opportunities are available to all Lion s. But you might think that you don't know how to lead or that you don't know enough about Lions to be able to lead because you are a new Lion or have been a Lion for a while but have not been involved in leadership. Our state organization's purpose statement is that it is a volunteer organization dedicated to leadership development through community service.

For new Lions: How can you go from being a new Lion to being a successful club president in just four years? Past President Doug Fitzgerald and President Lynn Nostrandt of the Big Rapids Lions Club can tell you: attend the Michigan Lions Leadership Institute at the MacMullan Center at Higgins Lake. For experienced Lions: even if you have taken a few more years to get there, the Leadership Institute is still an excellent way to develop your leadership skills, learn more about Lions, and meet a lot of excellent Lions from across the state, and make friends for life. You will also enjoy some very good food.

The program begins on Friday, November 13, at mid-day and runs through Sunday, November 15 until noon. It runs through the day and until 8:15 in the evening, so you are busy most of the time, but there is time to socialize at meals and after evening classes. You will learn about dealing with people, how to think about people, speaking and listening skills, and how to resolve conflicts. Other topics include team building, managing change, mentoring, and personal effectiveness. Finally, you will develop an action plan so you will know what you are going to do with your new knowledge.

The Leadership Institute lets you develop your leadership skills as a Lion and as a person. Although Lion's leadership is a little different because we are a volunteer organization, the ideas presented can be applied to almost any leadership situation.




