Since I have been your 2ndVDG, I have attended 4 training seminars in different locations in the state. Each covered a variety of information on how to become an effective leader and how to use all of the resources available. In addition the classes were all scheduled in conjunction with the Council of Governors meetings. This program has enabled us to meet with all state leaders and take advantage of their shared knowledge.

The following is a highlight of subjects covered at the State Forum held in Grand Blanc February 21, 22, and 23:

- 1. Training for setting up Zoom Calls Statewide to cut down travel time and related costs.
- 2. District 11E-2 has already set up Zoom Calls to be a part of their Cabinet meetings. Also, the equipment can be borrowed from our State office.
- 3. Leader Dog currently have a good supply of puppies for Lions to raise.

The members of this committee are always willing to make presentations for clubs and Districts. It is the goal of this committee that each district be 100% for Leader Dog. It only requires one annual donation.

- 4. Your Council of Governors has endorsed PID Douglass Alexander from Brooklyn as 1st VP of Lions International.
- 5. Hunger Report: Worldwide 800 million people suffer daily. Estimates by the USDA indicate 40 million people in the USA suffer and 12.5 million are children. In Michigan 1.4 million are adults and 345,000 are children! They all need our service.
- 6. Childhood Cancer: A grant proposal has been written to LCIF for \$37,500. Jeff Hunt will be the fund administrator.
- 7. Diabetes: We have 5 Districts currently that have almost completed their programs and spent their money. There is a voluntary plan set up that if a district does not spend their allocated funds, the funds can be transferred to other districts. We are now looking at our first Indian Reservation for A1C Screenings and our first school district for Dinning With Diabetes Nutritional Cooking. Also the D.A.D. program will be set up to perform A1C Screenings at our upcoming District Convention at the end of the month.
- 8. Our 100th Centennial Celebration will be held in Holland, May 14-16. Check our website for registration information.

This will make the final preparations for the Memorial Service go much smoother. Please note that if any Lions member passes after the cutoff date of March 15, 2020, you have the choice this year of getting that member added to the Memorial Program this year right up until the convention or you may wait to have that member honored at the 2021 convention.
