OMG! No Way!

Immediate Past District Governor Jim Patterson

If that title has always been your first response whenever asked to be a Lions leader, <u>you're exactly</u> the person we need.

For the past two newsletters I've talked about the need for district leadership. I've made the case that district leadership is the best way to spread your vision of Lionism. I've also made the case that leadership takes qualities we all possess. And finally, I've made the case that taking on a leadership role makes you a better person and a better Lion.

Now please go back and reread that very first sentence.

It's true! You're the one we need! Your reluctance will make you the ideal leader. You know what you don't know and are willing to learn. You are fearful of making a mistake, so you work to minimize mistakes. You hate it when people BS you, so you never do that to others. You keep your promises and people who don't drive you crazy. Most importantly, you're not a person who tries to do everything and never asks for help.

How do I know this? Because I was a VERY reluctant leader. I said "NO" loudly for a long time. And then one day, I weakly said "yes." My mantra became "Don't let me suck at this." And with the help of some great Lions, I did OK at being a governor. I'm not saying I got everything right, but I am pretty sure I didn't suck.

The task of being a good governor takes time – time to discover the width and breadth of our district; time to learn the tools available to help governors do their job; time to find good people to help in the task – and more.

That is why it is so important for Lions to serve as vice district governor for one to two years. It helps them grow into the job. In addition, the training LCI and the Lions of Michigan offers all vice governors is invaluable. Being comfortable in the job comes from familiarity with the ins-and-outs of our district. That familiarity doesn't come overnight.

Further, district governors don't act alone. They have great mentors. There are enormously talented and committed Lions in our district. No matter what comes up, some Past District Governor has seen it before. A wealth of experience is no more than a phone call or email away.

Will you serve as First or Second Vice District Governor?

Don't immediately say "OMG No Way!" Think about it. Mull it over in your mind. Why did you join the Lions in the first place? Wasn't it to help people in your community? Now imagine your community as more than just inside the town limits. Think of the good you could do helping people all over northwestern Michigan.

By the time you read this, the written nomination deadline will have passed. Your avenue to a vice district governorship is to be nominated from the floor during the cabinet meeting at the district convention. You will need to find two club members: one to nominate you and one to second the nomination. That's all there is to it. The election will take place that day and you will be starting a great adventure that will change your life in so many positive ways. Congratulations!

service each club provides. If you or another member can bring the banner along with a banner pole and/or stand that would be great. The district has 12 extra stands that will be set up for those who don't have their own.




Silent Auction


As we gear up for our District's **Spring Convention**, we are excited to host a **Silent Auction** to help defray the cost of the event. To make this a success, we need your help!

<u>Friday Dinner:</u> Dinner will be buffet style to include three cheese & beef lasagna, garlic & herb baked chicken, Mac & cheese, real mashed potatoes with gravy, soup of the day, mix salad greens/dressing, tuna salad, Italian pasta salad, cottage cheese, dessert, and beverages (Tea, coffee, soft drink).

Saturday Breakfast: Breakfast will be buffet style to include scrambled eggs, sausage links, thick cut bacon, French toast, herb roasted red potatoes, sausage gravy & buttermilk biscuits, fresh baked pastries and muffins, fresh fruit, and beverages (Tea, coffee, orange juice).

<u>Saturday Lunch</u>: Lunch will be buffet style to include two soups, salad bar, and chicken salad, beverages (Tea, coffee, soft drink) and dessert.

<u>Saturday Banquet:</u> Banquet will be buffet style to include beef stroganoff-egg noodles, baked lemon pepper cod, baked pork loin, herb roasted red potatoes, rice pilaf, green beans, California blend (cauliflower, broccoli & carrots), salad bar, desserts (cookies, brownies, and carrot cake) and beverages (Tea, coffee, soft drink).

All of the meals have been discounted for a total savings of \$18.82 to make it more affordable for Lions to attend those events.

Meal tickets will be provided for each meal purchased and must be presented during the meal.

We are forever grateful to the Mount Clemens Lions Club for the donation of a zero-turn lawn mower, improving the ability to maintain the grounds efficiently and keeping them safe for campers and visitors.

In January the Bear Lake Team focused on thorough cleaning and essential maintenance to prepare for a busy anticipated record attendance year ahead. Special attention was given to the kitchen, which was deep cleaned, sanitized and reorganized to meet the highest standards for safety and efficiency.

The camp truck and snowplow have been heavily used this winter to manage the exceptional snowy conditions and keep the grounds clear and accessible as the camp is open year-round. The Team also worked on equipment, inspections and repairs to ensure everything is in excellent condition for the upcoming season.

In addition to the Bear Lake Deaf and Hard of hearing youth camp July 13 - 19th the Deaf and Hard of Hearing "FAMILY" Camp will again be offered in August for a weekend of fun for impacted families.

On May 10, 2025, LIONS THROUGH OUT MICHIGAN and Lapeer local community members are welcomed for the ANNUAL Bear Lake Camp "WORK BEE." This event is a chance to prepare the camp for summer while exploring the facilities and connecting with others. For those who haven't visited or visited recently it's an opportunity to see all the updates and improvements that have been made. I know several of you already advised me of your plan on attending and assisting at this event. There's a job for everyone. It's both indoor and outdoor tasks that need to get done. around the camp. Painting, dusting, prepping the grounds and outdoor sports equipment, cleaning 10 cabins, clearing trails, sprucing up and organizing areas and spaces. This is a one-day event with lunch provided. Certainly, no worries about any special dietary needs as they've got that covered

after working with 1100 kids last summer. Volunteers are encouraged to bring gloves, outdoor and garden tools (rakes, power trimmers, etc.) and plenty of energy.

The Certified Guiding Lion Course will help you:


- 1. Understand your role as a Guiding Lion
