Fellow Lions,

For those of you who did not make the District Convention you missed a tremendous time. The fellowship with Lions from our district and the Lions of District 11 -C-1 was rewarding. No matter where you turned there was a fellow Lion with the same goal in mind that everyone had and that is taking care of our fellow man. It was great to see the projects represented and the seminars that were presented. Again congratulations to the IT Committee for putting on another great computer class.

There are many things that we need to do to help our fellow Lions and that is more extensive training for all offices. At times I feel like certain areas of our district are running blind due to the lack of training. At the current time we are at a minus 13 in membership for our district, with 12 0 new members and 133 dropped members. At the beginning of the year I stated that I wanted to reduce the number of dropped members by 50 percent. I have come nowhere near the goal that I set out to do, I started with a goal that the maximum we were to have would have been 87 drops. I guess what I need is to ask for your help in figuring out how we can reduce those drops? Starting July 1, 2009, I have set a goal with International to reduce our drops by 25 percent, which is a lot more achievable than I s et in the previous year. Again it depends on our clubs, our training and ability to keep our fellow Lions interested in what we are trying to achieve. At this time it is even hard to make clubs understand how important paper work is that needs to be filed with International. We will try ways to make it easier to file that paperwork for those of you who are having problems with the International website. I know for a fact that Lion Karla Roebuck, our IT chairman has set up many of these forms on our webs ite (www.milions11E1.org), so that all you have to do is fill them out and submit them to International which saves you time.

With our current membership being at a minus 13, I am asking clubs to concentrate very hard on getting new members and maintaining their membership. We are a currently 1384 members strong for our district that is a very small percentage of growth to have us come out with a plus number. Let's stand up, pull together and send our current Governor Larry out with a bang for the hard w ork that he has achieved.

Big Rapids Lions

Those of us in the Lions find time and serve in many different ways. King Lion Lee and his wife Judy Thomas have just returned from Pearlington MS on their 6 th mission trip to do reconstruction work.

Pearlington MS is a rural town of 1800 residents who were directly in the path of the eye of hurricane Katrina. Located along the Pearl River system 40 miles east of New Orleans and 20 miles inland from the gulf, it sustained strong winds and flood waters over 16 feet high. Only three houses were left without damage. Today there are a little over 1000 residents back in their homes.

After their first trip to Pearlington Lion Lee has taken the leadership role in organizing the work force going to this town.

Through the PDA, a seven year commitment has been given to work with the residents to rebuild. On their last trip in March, 19 volunteers including six Ferris State University students worked on three separate sites. Lee and Judy along with four others rebuilt and extended a deck. Another crew completed the rough in of electrical and plumbing. Others scraped, cleaned and painted at another site.

Lion Jim Chipman from the Big Rapids club has attended two of the trips using his electrical expertise to good use.

Lion Lee is exploring the possibility of providing eye exams and g lasses for those in needs in the Pearlington area. At present, there are no commercial businesses, schools or medical facilities in Pearlington. This leaves the residents a 20 plus mile drive to facilitate any of their needs and many of the residents are either low income or retirees.

Lion Lee is presently organizing the next trip to Pearlington on October 18th. These working trips leave on a Saturday and return on the following Saturday. Skilled or basic workers all can contribute. To experience this opportunity to serve contact Lion Lee at 888-972-7214.
