Hello All.

Due to the Covid-19 Virus we have placed a temporary hold on all Diabetes classes until it is safe to mingle once again. Currently there are 38,642 confirmed cases in Michigan and 3,499 deaths as of April 28th.

I hope you and your families are all safe and healthy. As of recent I have been in communication with our providers from MSU regarding development of D-PATH diabetes management online classes. I am happy to say we are ready to start recruiting participants. You will be able to participate in the

classes in the convenience and safety of your own homes so you won't have to travel. We are looking at start up dates sometime in May for the classes which are 2-1/2 hours long once a week for 6 weeks. All related costs are provided by our LCIF grant and includes 2 instructors from MSU and a training manual which is yours to keep and a certificate of completion. Since the crisis has started it has become common knowledge that people with diabetes are in more danger of becoming ill than those who are not diabetics and your immune system is not as strong to fight this terrible disease. This is the main reason why we have been working behind the scenes to develop this very necessary training class which does not propose any health threat to those who become involved. With most of our people being self-quarantined, it is an ideal time for people with diabetes, Lions, and the Public to take advantage of these classes. Family members can also participate. Our trusted professionals from MSU always do an excellent job as I have completed the class myself and can assure you that you will be pleased with the results.

There is no cost, no travel time, you have the time, and you won't be exposed to the public, so now is the most ideal time to sign up! What you need to do first is contact your Club President and sign up. He or She will send me a list with phone numbers and email addresses. You will be placed on a waiting list. You will be called for our classes that will start in May. This innovative idea could add years to your life. I would also like to thank the members of District 11E-1 for having the opportunity of serving as your 2nd VDG for the past year and I would appreciate your support as 1st VDG for the next year. Lions International HQ Oak Brook, Illinois, office closure extended to May 30

While staff will not physically be in the building, staff teams will be working remotely and available during business hours to respond to the needs of Lions. You may contact LCI staff or LCIF staff as needed. The performance of systems may be impacted due to the increased number of people working remotely, and response time may be affected. Some of our business operations that require physical interaction will likely be limited.

More details will be provided as the situation evolves, but here is some preliminary guidance:

- •Regarding payment of outstanding dues, we recommend that districts allow clubs that are able to demonstrate they have sent or submitted payment to participate in voting. This could be via a bank statement, copy of demand draft, etc. Clubs will not be cancelled during this time based on the challenges related to receiving and processing physical checks and electronic payments.
- •For Lions International payments, please utilize online payment options via MyLCI or any other electronic payment method (ACH, SEPA, Boleto, NEFT, etc.) instead of sending checks to the office.
- •Please <u>submit LCIF donations</u> via the website instead of sending checks to the office. Please also note that grant disbursements and recognition will be delayed while the office is closed.
- •There will be delays in shipping awards and recognitions, club supplies orders, as well as delays in processing reimbursements.
