1ST VDG Jim Patterson's Message



I met with the district's Global Action Team after the last cabinet meeting to discuss the results of the district wide SWOT analysis. While the responses were spread over a wide list of topics, there was a concentration around two issues:

<u>Communication:</u> Listed by several as a district strength while a similar number listed it as a weakness. Our conclusion is that the flow of information from the district leadership to the clubs and on to the members is not consistent.

<u>Training:</u> Responses fell into two categories: 1. Training for officers, committee chairs, etc. and 2. Training on technology. Flexibility

in scheduling was mentioned several times as was the need to incentivize attendance at trainings. Upon reflection, the team concluded that both issues are parts of the same puzzle. Here are some things we agree on:

- It is not fair to expect perfect performance from volunteers who take on committee positions without clear communication of what the expectations are.
- Having expectations is not enough. Volunteers must be provided the tools necessary to fulfill those expectations.
- Providing the tools must take place at a time and location that is the most convenient to the most people.

The real challenge is to find "do-able" solutions because of our district's demographics. We are 39 clubs scattered over 16 counties. Travel times are lengthy. Our smallest club is 4 members and our largest is over 50. We have clubs in rural areas, tourist towns, college towns, and manufacturing cities. Internet access is limited or non-existent in some areas.

There is no "one size fits all." Whatever we try will not be a perfect solution. The only thing our leadership team can do is to give our best efforts to find a solution that works for the most people most of the time.

Unless otherwise specified herein, the affirmative vote of a majority of delegates voting on any question shall be the act of the convention. All eligible delegates must be members in good standing of a club in good standing in this district. Delinquent dues may be paid and good standing acquired up to fifteen(15) days prior to the close of credential certification (12 noon, Saturday, April 22, 2023)

WHITE CANE

In honor of White Cane Safety Day, here are 10 quirky facts about the white cane:

- 1. Yes, it's legal to take a <u>white cane through security at an airport</u>, according to the TSA, but it has to go through the X-ray machine.
- White canes are white because of <u>George A. Bonham</u>. In 1930, Bonham, president of the Peoria Lions Club (Illinois), watched a man who was blind attempting to cross a street. The man's cane was black and motorists couldn't see it, so Bonham proposed painting the cane white with a red stripe to make it more noticeable. The idea quickly caught on around the country.
- 3. White canes are going high-tech. Inventors in <u>India</u>, <u>Great Britain</u> and France have equipped white canes with ultrasonic devices that detect obstacles up to nine feet away. Vibrations in the cane's handle warn users of potential hazards in their path.
- 4. The <u>standard technique for using a white cane</u> was pioneered in 1944 by Richard E. Hoover, a World War II veteran rehabilitation specialist. His technique of holding a long cane in the center of the body and swinging it back and forth before each step to detect obstacles is still called the "Hoover Method."
- 5. Most people who are visually impaired don't use a white cane. In fact, only an estimated 2 percent to <u>8 percent</u> do. The rest rely on their useable vision, a guide dog or a sighted guide.
- 6. There are actually three different kinds of white canes. There's the standard mobility cane, used to navigate. There's the support cane, used by people with visual impairments who also have mobility challenges. And there's the ID cane, a small, foldable cane used by people with partial sight to let others know they have a visual impairment.
- Unless you're willing to "walk the walk," you can't become a certified Orientation & Mobility specialist. O&M specialists teach white cane technique to people who are blind, but to become certified, you must spend at least 120 hours blindfolded, navigating with a white cane.
- Today's <u>modern, lightweight canes</u> are usually made from aluminum, fiberglass or carbon fiber, and can weigh as little as seven ounces. Some white cane users prefer straight canes, which are more durable, while others prefer collapsible canes, which can be folded and stored more easily.
- 9. White caning can be fun. The Braille Institute sponsors an annual <u>Cane Quest</u>, where youngsters aged 3-12 compete to quickly and safely navigate a route in their community using their white canes. The contest helps kids master proper white cane techniques and encourages independence.
- 10. In some states, it's <u>illegal for a person who is not legally blind</u> to use a white cane to gain right-of-way while crossing a street. Get caught in Florida, for example, and you'll face second-degree misdemeanor charges and up to 60 days in prison.
