"Compact the Zones" Contest Win a \$50 Visa Gift Card.

I spent a lot of time traveling to clubs and so on this year as First Vice. Next year I expect to travel a lot more. Lately I spent some time perusing the map of our district looking for ways to reduce my travel time and made a somewhat startling discovery: Some of our zones are very compact and others are stretched out.

To explain; there are 39 clubs scattered over 16 counties in our district. The district is divided into three regions and each region into 2 zones. In

some zones, the clubs are within a few miles of each other but in others there is considerable distance between them. For example, in Region 2, Zone 1, Midland is 90 miles from Baldwin. That's a three-hour round trip! Chances of Baldwin attending a zone meeting in Midland or vice-versa are pretty slim. There are other examples of a similar distance issue.

So, I got away from plotting my travels and onto trying to find ways to make our zones more compact. But I've been staring at the district map for too long! My eyes are crossed! I want to find a way to reorganize the zones in order to cut the travel time between clubs in the same zone to the absolute minimum. A whole bunch of minds are way more creative than my one small brain - so that's a darn good reason for a contest!

Announcing the first, and last ever, "Compact the Zones" Contest!

Use Google Maps or any other software aids you may have. Get out your compass and rulers and let your creativity do its thing! Put your best geocaching skills to work and rearrange our district into six zones with each zone containing approximately six or seven clubs in such a way as to minimize travel time between the clubs in that zone. I understand that there isn't a perfect solution but the person who comes up with the best one gets a \$50 Visa Gift Card.



The rules are:

- 1. Contest is open to all district Lions & their family members put your kids and grandkids on it!
- 2. Try to keep three zones having six clubs and three having seven for a total of 39 clubs in six zones. The six club-seven club thing is not a hard requirement but you'll earn extra love if you can pull it off.
- 3. The distance between the clubs within a zone must be as short as possible.
- 4. The contest is over at the end of the day June 1, 2023.
- 5. Since it's my money I'm giving away, I'm the judge and the judge's decision is final.
- 6. In case of a tie, winner will be determined by a blind drawing OK, not really blind but I promise to keep my eyes closed when I draw the winner.

Global Membership Team Report April 21, 2023

The data I am using in this report is what has been reported to LCI as of March 2023. There are currently 39 clubs in District 11E1 with 925 members. Of those clubs, since July 1st, 13 have lost membership, 14 have gained membership and 12 have remained the same. Overall, we have gained 66 members and have lost 79 for a net decrease of 13 members. Of our 79 lost members 38 of them came from four clubs. On a positive note, 25 out of 39 clubs have added at least 1 new member this year.

I do believe overall the numbers are encouraging, and we are in a position to end the year with a positive membership growth. I am available to assist any club that would like to set up a membership drive in the next couple of months. My contact information is in the directory.

GST Report April 2023

In the past 3 months, several new clubs in 11E1 have reported their service on MyLion. We are now at 67% reporting. I am still hopeful that we can get closer to 100% before June 30!

There was a successful Service project at the Forum in February benefiting the Grand Rapids Kid's Food Basket which prepares backpacks of healthy food daily to as many as 2,000 school children. Our district provided Ziplock bags for snacks to be put into. Lions from around the state filled the bags with fruit cups, cheese crackers, meat sticks and other items donated for the project. It was good to be able to help this worthwhile organization.

The Sock Hop project is well under way. Many clubs in our district have been collecting socks for the needy. To date, we have collected 2,168 pairs of socks! Clubs have delivered socks to homeless shelters, domestic violence shelters, pregnancy centers, community centers, schools, and other agencies such as Goodwill and Safe Harbor (youth) in all of our 16 counties! In May I will deliver the rest (many more than the suggested 25 pairs of men's, women's and children's socks) to Muskegon to be given to three homeless shelters during the Multi-District Convention.


This weekend during the District 11E1 convention, we will work on 2 service projects for children with cancer. Friday evening and Saturday morning, Lions can string bead necklaces using materials donated by PCC Peggy Allen of District 11B1. And on Saturday morning we will be tying fleece blankets as well. The necklaces and blankets will all be delivered to Maggie's Wigs 4 Kids, Inc. in St. Clair Shores, MI. Maggie provides free wigs to kids with hair loss, many of whom are undergoing chemo treatments for cancer. She also gives kids the Lion-made necklaces and fleece blankets. 
