The beautiful statue of Helen Keller as a child that was just placed in the Capitol Rotunda in Washington reminds us as Lions of the charge that she gave us, to be Knights of the Blind. Although the statue is a representative of Alabama, Helen Keller's inspirational life belongs to all Americans and to all people. Could any of us imagine what our world would be like if we had been born without sight or hearing.

On October 17, at Finch Field house on Central Michigan University's campus, there will be a disabilities fair sponsored in part by Deaf-Blind Central, a clearing house of information about services and help for children who are deaf, blind, or both. Mt. Pleasant Lions Club will have a booth there to do sight screening and to let people know about Lions. This will be just one of the many Lions' projects this year to help those with vision and hearing problems. Each of these projects deserves our taking note and appreciation of it. As Lions, we have many vision and hearing programs throughout the year, especially eye glass and hearing aid programs in almost all clubs, KidSight programs, and my own favorite, Opening Eyes, testing eyes and fitting glasses to all Special Olympics athletes who need them. IPDG Larry Morlock had Knights as his theme, giving us a year-long reminder that programs to help the blind and to restore sight and hearing are a large part of our mission as Lions. In our district we have Bear Lake Camp and Camp Tuhsmeheta, otherwise known as Camp T, Project KidSight, Sigh t Conservation/Diabetes Awareness, and the Ear Lab as District projects. For the state, we have Michigan Eye Bank, Leader Dog, and Welcome Homes, now under new management as projects. To achieve our mission, we need for all clubs to contribute to all district, state, and international projects, and especially to those that help people with vision and hearing problems. So when you are raising money for Lions' projects remember our charge from Helen Keller. Let's continue to be Knights of the Blind.
