
Lion Richard Maguire served as Master of Ceremonies, Lions William Raymor, and Don Veitengruber (Chaplains) began and ended the evening's activities.

Each member in attendance received a 50 year pin, and Lion Richard Goedge was presented with his 35 year service pin.



PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE

11-E1 DISTRICT CONSTITUTION

1. A RESOLUTION TO CLARIFIY ARTICLE 1, SECTION 9 ON PAGE 4 OF OUR CONSTITUTION. THE LAST SENTENCE OF THE FIRST PARAGRAPH READS "The fund so collected shall be used exclusively for defraying expenses of district convention and shall be expended only by district checks drawn and signed by the Cabinet Treasurer, Cabinet Secretary or District Governor.

SHALL THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION BE ADOPTED?

Be it resolved that Article I Section 9 of the District Constitution be ame nded by adding the words "and the unreimbursed expenses of the District Governor in attending the International Convention" The new sentence reads:

"The fund so collected shall be used exclusively for defraying expenses of district convention and the unreimbursed expenses of the District Governor in attending the International Convention and shall be expended only by district checks drawn and signed by the Cabinet Treasurer, Cabinet Secretary or District Governor."

2. A RESOLUTION TO CHANGE THE WORD AUDIT IN ARTICLE IV SECTION 7 PARAGRAPH (F) SO IT READS AS FOLLOWS:

SHALL THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION BE ADOPTED?

Be it resolved that Article IV Section 7 Paragraph (f) be rewritten to read as follows: "Provide for an **annual review** of the books and accounts of the cabinet secretary, cabinet treasurer, or cabinet secretary -treasurer and District Convention Fund, and with the district governor's approval, set up definite schedule of dates, times and places of cabinet meetings to be held during the fiscal y ear.

3. A RESOLUTION TO CHANGE ARTICLE VII, SUB SECTION B NOMINATION AND ELECTION OF THE DISTRICT TRUSTEE FOR LIONS OF MICHIGAN SERVICE FOUNDATION, INC. THIS TO BE DONE TO CORRESPONDE WITH THE LIONS OF MICHIGAN FOUNDATION'S CONSTITUTION.

SHALL THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION BE ADOPTED?

Be it resolved that Article VII, Sub Section B, Section 1,sentence 1 to read as follows" District 11E1 shall be represented by two(2) elected trustees on the Board of Trustees of the Lions of Michigan Service Foundation, Inc.

This removes the words District Governor from the sentence
