Dear Fellow Lions,

It's great to be back in the USA after visiting Italy for a week last month to attend a conference in my science, psychophysics. I had a wonderful time there. I took day trips to Venice and Florence and stayed for the conference in Padua. While I was there, I met with a number of Lion presidents and a zone chair form Padua. None of the nine clubs in Padua had a meeting while I was there, so the two club presidents, to whom I wrote, organized a meeting with club presidents and some members from five of the clubs. We met in the oldest trattoria (bar-restaurant) in Padua where they ordered lots of hors d'oeuvres and more drinks than I could consume. After having our picture taken (see below) a smaller group took me to see the city's pride, frescos of the New Testament, depicting scenes from the time Mary and Joseph were children through to the Book of Revelation. These frescos were painted in 1303-1305 by Giotto. The Chapel in which they were painted was built to compensate for the sin of money lending committed the already dead father and his repentant son. The tour was narrated by the curator of the Chapel. She is also a Lion. It was very beautiful and very moving.

I think that there is a lesson for Lions in my experience: Visit other Lions and their clubs. If you get a chance while on vacation or a business trip, check for Lions Clubs in the area and give the President a call or email. District Governor Laura has a book that lists all the Lions Clubs in the world. She was kind enough to let me have her extra copy. So if you cannot find a club through the Lions International web site, ask one of us. We will be glad to help.

It is also great to visit other Lions Clubs in Michigan, in or out of our district. If given notice, clubs are welcoming of visitors, and you can learn how other clubs do things. It may give you some useful ideas, but it will certainly introduce you to some new friends. Lions are great people. Our International President, Sid Scruggs, says that Lions are loving individuals offering needed services where needed. They are also friendly, wonderful folks, but you can find that out only by visiting them or coming to conventions.
