like to have 2 volunteers, preferably 4, at each site to pass out our DAD flyers and let people know that the Lions of Michigan and the Lions Clubs International Foundation are providing the funding through the Defense Against Diabetes (DAD) Program.

He has chaired their nut sale, refurbished their popcorn wagon, and chaired a committee that created the Fremont Scholarship Award. As the Fremont Lions President in 2014-15, he guided the club through a complete revision of their constitution and bylaws and the creation of the club's first Board Policy Handbook. He chaired Fremont's Millionaire Party Committee– running Texas Hold 'Em tournaments and raffles. When the state gaming commission decertified organizations, he handled the recertification process that took nine months. He has chaired the Fremont Pancake

Breakfast Committee since 2013. Jim designed the Fremont Lake Park Pavilion and along with Lion Roger Bradshaw headed up its construction as Fremont Lions Legacy Project. At the District level, Lion Jim has been Youth Exchange Chair, All State Band Chair, and Region 3 Zone 2 Chair. He has played his guitar and sung at several District Conventions. Jim has received many awards for his work as a Lion. To mention a few, Bronze Leader Dog Founders Award, Lautzenheiser Fellowship, Melvin Jones, Charles Weir Sight Fellowship, and the Mike Howard "Spirit of Lionism Award". Jim is a retired high school industrial arts teacher. He has two children and three step-children. He and his wife Sherry have been married for 22 years. He is an amateur musician, playing guitar and singing since he was 14 years old. He performs monthly and donates his earning to the Food Bank of TrueNorth Community Services.

If 8 people will take on the job of scheduling one site and doing all associated duties, (I will take one site), we can keep the screenings going. I've done a lot of work over the years to make contacts and "sell" the program and I really don't want to see it stopped. The preschool directors that we serve always want us to come back and they value our service. The "selling" aspect of this work has been done. To give you an idea of what is involved (this is not all inclusive):

Email the director and ask to schedule a date.

Email our volunteer list, asking for volunteers for your date. Must include 1 certified screener. Confirm volunteers.

Get names and birthdates of students with consent forms, 1-2 days ahead of your date, enter info into camera before your date.

After screening, get certain forms to Ann Roeseler, usually by dropping them at the office at Trinity Lutheran, and Ann picks them up later.

Diabetes



Diabetes is the signature cause of Lions and Leos worldwide. This year, **Lions Clubs International** is on a mission to screen 1 million people for prediabetes and diabetes. Help us reach our goal on World Diabetes Day (November 14) by taking the online risk assessment or organizing a screening in your community. **Lions** are teaming up to increase awareness around a disease that affects 1 out of 3 Adults. Half of seniors have prediabetes and 80% don't even know they have prediabetes. **COULD IT BE YOU?**

We're asking ALL Lions members and clubs to participate in a

challenge to screen 1 million people for prediabetes and diabetes. Together, we can educate communities to better understand, prevent and care for diabetes.

OPTION ONE - Online Risk Assessment

Finding out if you're at risk for prediabetes or diabetes is simple. You can complete the test at <u>https://doihaveprediabetes.org</u> in roughly 5 minutes and a few clicks....then encourage others to take the assessment. Assess Your Risk! We are asking ALL Lion's members and Clubs to share the above screening link on your social media page on the day of the event and ask your friends to do the same.

OPTION TWO - Organize a Screening Project on that day.

Clubs can make a difference by organizing a screening project in their communities. The ADA Diabetes paper Risk Test is available through Globe Printing at 906-485-1033 and they can coordinate shipping and quantity AT NO COST to the Club. Have a Lions member set up a display at a location in your community. Besides entering the information in myLION, email your LCIF Diabetes Program Manager/Administrator of your screening on November 14th.

Report Your Screening

To reach our goal of 1 million screened, it's important for all of us to report our service. After your clubs screening, be sure to report your activity on MyLion.

PROJECT IDEAS

- Work with a healthcare professional to organize an educational talk about diabetes, pre-diabetes, prevention and management at your club or district meeting.
- Facilitate a discussion about diabetes to encourage club members to share their personal connections to the disease.
- Share a low calorie high nutrient snacks such as fruits and vegetables at your club meeting and ask a nutritionist or diabetes educator to teach club members and their families about interpreting food labels.
- Sign-up for myLION and learn how Lions and Leos are getting involved in diabetes service.
- Download an app that educates and encourages healthy lifestyle choices. Invite club members to participate in healthy lifestyles related challenge.
- Newspaper: Lions for Diabetes Awareness event in your community.
- Partner with healthcare professionals to organize a screening for diabetes, diabetic retinopathy and diabetic foot.
- Promote diabetes prevention through social media campaigns or radio announcements.
- Volunteer for a day at a diabetes center
- Sponsor a healthy cooking demonstration for people with diabetes and pre-diabetes.
- Organize a weekly walking club at your place of work and share a healthy snack afterwards.
- Bring fresh fruits or vegetables to an elementary school classroom to encourage children to try a variety of healthy foods.
- Collaborate with a healthcare professional to organize a physical activity and promote exercise and healthy eating.
- Sponsor a training program for community healthcare workers to learn about screening, community support programs and prevention of diabetes complications.

- 4. For the MD GLT position you will be given a topic to present as a full-fledged training session.
- 5. For the MD GMT position you will need to list your experience with membership both recruitment and retention from the club to district to state levels.
- 6. For the MD GST position you will need to list your experience as it pertains to service and service projects from the club to district to state levels.

If these positions are something you'd like to consider in the future, here are some hints to start qualifying:

- 1. Build your credentials as a Lions trainer. Continue to do training and presentations at the district level. Serve as the District GLT/GMT/GST Coordinator. Get involved in training at the state level, such as doing presentations at the Michigan Forum and serving on the committee.
- If you have not already done so, hold the offices of Zone and Region Chair and District Governor to gain the experience base and Lions leadership skills for conducting position-specific training. (While it's true that you can teach a topic without direct experience, there's nothing like "been there, done that" to build a solid rapport with your students.)
