2ND VDG AL ROESELER'S MESSAGE

At the end of July, Ann and I were invited to an event at the EverSight Facility in Ann Arbor. The program included a tour of the facility and much information about their history and mission. EverSight (known until recently as Michigan Eye Bank) was founded in 1957 as a joint effort of the Ann Arbor Host Lions Club and the University of Michigan Hospital Ophthalmology Department. It has grown from five coronial transplants in its first year to 2,342 in 2015. Throughout its history EverSight has been supported in part by donations from Michigan Lions Clubs. In addition Clubs have aided in signing people up for the donor registry. Today 54% of Michigan adults are registered for donations, and because they are part of an international network, there is no waiting list for transplants. On our tour there were two things I found most impressive. First their collection technicians work state wide 24/7/365 to collect corneas for transplant. This means day or night, good weather or bad; they are out on the road visiting hospitals, morgues, and funeral homes to make sure that no donor tissue is wasted. The second was the call center. After a donors death the immediate family needs to be contacted to confirm the donation, and review a health questionnaire to determine if the donor had any medical conditions that would preclude the use of their corneas. The people tasked with making those phone calls are special people indeed. The visit was inspirational and made me even prouder to be a Lion. I would urge you and your club to begin, continue, or increase your support of this incredible facility.
