#### CONGRATULATIONS TO PDG LYN MAST - LIONS OF MICHIGAN HALL OF FAME




PDG Lynwood Mast (Fremont Lions Club) was inducted into the Lions Hall of Fame in Mt. Pleasant on August 3.



We made \$3,669 from shooters, which is more than \$200 higher than last year, and the highest amount since we changed to 8 days of operation. Our net income for 2019 is over \$11,000.

#### Reading Action Program (RAP)

Did you know that Lions International has a Reading Action Program? To quote the program introduction, "Join Lions from around the world to implement reading and educational projects and help increase literacy rates. Whether it is organizing a community spelling contest or donating books or computers to your local library or school, take part in a hands-on project and show the impact of Lions work".



A few suggested ideas for projects that you might take on include:

- Help an after school reading program
- Read to children at local libraries and schools
- Work with local literacy experts and agencies to promote reading
- Read or record books on tape for the blind and visually impaired
- Provide internet connection for a school or library

The program has a much longer list of possibilities to include "Provide free books for children at a vision or hearing screening or other service activity for children". So if you are giving out books at KidSight screenings, you are already a participant. You are asked to share your project online by logging on to MyLCI and telling about your project. Submit stories and images and you could be featured in future Lions Clubs International materials.


