International Convention

The International Convention will be July 6-10, 2009, in Minneapolis, Minnesota. The Michigan delegation will be housed at the Ramada Mall of America in Bloomington at a room rate of \$119 per night, plus tax. The hotel is 10 miles from the convention center.

The hotel is 2 blocks from the Mall of America and 2 miles from the airport. It has 248 rooms, free parking, complimentary high speed wireless internet, indoor/outdoor pools and a fitness room. There is an on-site café/pub that serves breakfast, lunch and dinner. The hotel provides complimentary 24 hour shuttle service. An online convention registration form is available at lionsclubs.org


The Friday night mix and meet will feature a comedy show. District C-1 has hired a comedian to entertain us. We will have the cash bar and hors d`oeuvres.

ARTICLE XI SECTION 7 of the District 11-E-1 Constitution and By-Laws so states that: Each chartered Club in good standing in Lions International and the District shall be represented by one or more delegates at the District Convention and shall be entitled in each such Convention to one (1) voting delegate and one (1) alternate for each ten (10) members, or major fraction thereof, of said Club as shown by the records of the International Office on the first day of the month last preceding the month during which the Convention is held. The major fraction referred to in this section shall be five (5) or more members. Further, full delegate Status shall be accorded each Past District Governor who is a member of a Club in this District, independent of the Club delegate quotas herein above specified. Each certified delegate present in person may cast one (1) vote for each office to be filled and one (1) vote only on each issue to be voted on by the members of said Convention. Unless otherwise specified herein, the affirmative vote of a majority of the delegates voting on any question shall be the act of the Convention.
