Presentation; DG Bill presented a Certificate of Appreciation to IPDG John Monahan for Service to his District from Lions International.

Governor's Remarks

Where is our district heading and will we be ready for the future? The answer is probably yes if we engineer the future we want.

We belong to one of the largest rural districts in Lower Michigan. LCI says districts similar to ours will have a hard time growing in the future. They attribute this situation to a variety of reasons. First, the size of cities and density of our populations is much lower than urban areas and give us less to draw from for new members. In addition, our population tends to be older and on fixed incomes making it more difficult to find those able to volunteer in their communities. With this in mind it's very important that we plan our future. I've asked PDG Wayne to work on this topic and talk with us concerning long term planning. Maybe we can put our heads together or form a committee that will work toward some goals that save money and point to the future.

One objective I'd like to suggest is that we eliminate or off set the yearly cost of roster books which typically cost us \$800.00 to \$900.00 per year. Typically each club gets three books and when we multiply by 46 that equals 138 books. That does not include those given to district officers, committee chairs, the state office, state projects and 10 others districts in Michigan. Of the 300 that I ordered there 22 left over. If we only charged each club \$6.00 per book that would equal \$828.00. This figure nearly eliminates the cost without over burdening a small club, and if a club or two doesn't choose to purchase rosters, this information is available without cost on the district web site.

Another large expense is the Governor's pin, where costs continue to rise and with our reduce numbers sales continue to fall......but I'll leave that discussion for the planning committee if one is formed.

Due to all of your hard work, our district's population loss is slowing, however, drops still outnumber adds. November saw our membership at 1261 and December at 1259 with a total new membership of 35 Lions and 54 people that have left our family group.

More positive news is that only 14% of North American clubs do not have women members compared to 25% worldwide. I think we have finally seen the light!!

I mentioned earlier that we were doing a reasonable job of retaining our numbers even when LCI says it expects little growth from rural area such as ours. These rural areas contain 70% of Lions Clubs and only 41% of the population to draw from.

After DG Bill gave his report a discussion was held about the cost of roster books and whether to charge the clubs back for their cost, approx \$6.00 per book. Lion Kay Brandt made a motion to charge clubs \$6.00 for each roster book that they ordered with the understanding that clubs could print them FREE off our web site. PDG Jerry Brandt seconded the motion and discussion followed. (**NOTE:** This was an improper motion as neither Lions Kay nor Jerry are voting members of our cabinet per our Constitution. I did not catch this at the time only when I started to do the Minutes. Secretary Jim)

IPDG John Monahan made a motion to table the above motion until our next cabinet meeting and have the strategic planning committee review what to do about the roster books and the Governor's Pin and send a written report to all cabinet members prior to our next meeting. This motion was supported by PDG Jim Chipman, secretary, and it passed.

The following Lions were appointed to the strategic planning committee to assist Chair PDG Wayne Kreitner; IPDG John Monahan, PDG Lynn Mast and PDG Harry Johnson.

SECRETARY'S REPORT PDG Jim Chipman made a motion to accept the minutes of October 7, 2012 as published. Motion supported by ZC Pam Schroeder and it passed.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Lion Kerry McGinley presented copies of his financial report and stated that he had filed the 990 report to the IRS on time. The CD at State Farm comes due on the 20th of May and he will turn this over to the new treasurer for 2013-14.

Lion Kerry asked to have something done with the LCIF designated fund as it has been not used for years. Lion Jim Chipman made motion to send it to LCIF and use it for a Melvin Jones Fellow when we get it to \$1000.00. The amount of money in the fund is \$500.00. Lion ZC Pam Schroeder supported and it passed. Report follows;

IPDG John Monahan made motion to accept registration fees and meal prices as presented. Motion supported by ZC Mike Howard and it passed.

The Cabinet members had some concerns over the convention cost, entertainment and continuing with C-1 partnership beyond 2014. No action was taken on any item discussed.

GLOBAL MEMBERSHIP TEAM; IPDG John Monahan report follows;

Made a table for contacting Club Membership Chairpersons.

On Friday, 1/11/13 I sent the ones with email addresses a note asking what they had done to recruit new members and what the district could do to help them. Two addresses were incorrect out of 13 total. I have, unsurprisingly, not yet heard back from them. I plan to call the rest in the next two weeks.

2nd VDG Pete ran a successful membership initiative. He reports that membership chairs are often uninterested in recruiting. Maybe we should consider a different approach beyond membership chairpersons. Although it seems to make no sense, some clubs are not trying to recruit, for reasons specific to the club. If we plan to keep Lionism going, we need additional members to replace those we lose so that we can continue to serve our community.

My impression is that if a club can get publicity coverage on at least a monthly basis, it can recruit. Otherwise, it may be difficult.

CLUB MEMBERSHIP REWARD PROGRAM: 2nd VDG Pete Conarty sent letter to all clubs that will receive a rebate from the District for increasing membership over their June M-Report. Checks will be sent as soon as the secretary can verify per our Oct. 7th 2012 minutes.

GLOBAL LEADERSHIP TEAM; PCC Richard Perrin reported as follows;

Club Excellence/Success Program

Several clubs are going through the first steps of the CEP/CSP program with the help of facilitators. The next steps will be the review of the results with the clubs and to develop action plans to address the important issues that the club feels need to be addressed.

Several clubs have used the "How Are Your Ratings" survey on their own without having a facilitator. Those clubs are asked to contact me so that the GLT team can have a record of the number of clubs using CEP program.

Michigan Lions Leadership Institute - Basic and Graduate

District 11-E1 was well represented at the institute. Two district Lions attended the graduate institute this year.

Lions Clubs International (LCI) offers many leadership development opportunities and all Lions are encouraged to participate in them.

New Member Orientation Programs

New club members need to be assigned a mentor soon after they are inducted into the club. The mentor can be the new Lion's sponsor or another Lion who is willing to guide the Lion into Lionism. LCI offers a Mentoring Program which can be used or a club-developed program can also be used. The important thing is to get the new Lion involved in the club.

Club Officer Training Programs

Thanks to all the Zone Chairs who arranged times and places for the training of new club officers during the past year. The GLT team appreciates all of their efforts.

Thanks also to all the Lions who served as trainers during the past year.

The GLT team will be reviewing the content of the sessions to be sure that we are meeting the needs of the Lions who are serving as club officers. Any input from Lions or clubs would be greatly appreciated.

Training sessions will be offered again as new officers are chosen for the 2013-2014 Lions year.

LIONS OF MICHIGAN FOUNDATION: Lion Ron Gibson;

The Foundation has agreed to take over the operation of Project Kidsight and to assume all liabilities and assets. Liabilities are problems with the filing of the 990 form and some \$20,000.00 owed to the prior administrator. This money will be paid from Lions Mints sold outside the State of Michigan. No Michigan Lions donations or Mint sale monies will be used to pay off this liability. The benefits of the Foundation running the program could be many, such as taking responsibility for taking care of cameras, insurance and many other items not yet thought of. It may help the Foundation in writing of Grants.

Sight and Hearing tickets have been mailed to all clubs and you are urged to sell these tickets. The goal this year is to sell \$100,000.00 worth of tickets, which could put \$50,000.00 into the Lions Clubs treasury, if each club sold 100 tickets. Last year two clubs from District 11-E1 sold 100 tickets, Big Rapids and White Cloud and received \$500.00. Drawing will be held April 27, 2013 in West Branch.

KIDSIGHT; PCC Janalee McClure;

The Foundation has updated all the forms and procedures, effective January 1, 2013, for Project Kidsight. The new forms have been emailed to all the camera persons in the District for 2012-2013 by First vice Governor Tim and I have made 'hands on' folders for Lions Bill Koch, Bob Thompson and PDG Dan Gibbons. There haven't been any changes on the Kidsight Board as yet and PDG Linda Bosma's contract expired on Dec. 31, 2012. I am still the State Treasurer but for untold reasons the

funds have not been coming in at all in January. Only time will tell if the procedure changes will be successful.

CONSTITUTION & BY LAWS; PCC Janalee McClure:

POLICY MANUAL: PCC Janalee McClure:

Policy Manual addition according to the October 7, 2012 Cabinet Minutes to include the shirts that the Governor purchased for the Zone Chairs & the GLT & GMT.

If this cabinet would like to have that included in the policy manual I would suggest:

Section C

3. Financial Policies

d) At the Governor's discretion, the District will pay for shirts of the Governor's choice for the Region, Zone, GMT and GLT Chairs and the District will pay for meals of official guests and speakers invited by the District to a District function.

Note: The new wording in d) is italic and bold.

Motion by secretary Chipman to authorize the change to the Policy Manual as suggested. Supported by ZC Connie McMorris and it passed.

1st VDG Tim Anderson; The Foundation has asked the Districts to turn over the ownership of Project Kidsight Cameras to the Foundation and in return they will take over the expenses of the camera's. IPDG John Monahan said before any action could be taken he has to check with the grant people to see if that would be a problem and he would do so before our next meeting, so we can take the appropriate action then.

PEACE POSTER; Lion John C. Monahan.

The theme for this year is "Our World Our Future" and the sale of new kits will commence on the 15th of January. The cost per kit is \$10.95 and sales will end on October 15th. Last year 10 clubs participated and Midland Lions Club was the sponsor of the winning poster from our District. They also have an essay contest for the sight impaired. Presently we present a US Savings bond to the District winner for \$100.00 that cost the District \$50.00. To purchase a savings bond now requires a deposit of \$200.00 and you have to have a Social Security number. PROGRAM AREA SERVED:

Primarily West Michigan but also serving children and youth throughout Michigan. Campers and counselors also come from out-of-state or foreign countries.

BRIEF HISTORY AND DESCRIPTION OF ORGANIZATION:

In 1970, the Michigan School for the Blind, acquired 297 acres of hilly wooded land with frontage on three lakes and a wide variety of ecosystems near Greenville, MI to be used as an outdoor education and recreation center, named Camp Tuhsmeheta (Camp T). In 1994, Opportunities Unlimited for the Blind (OUB) was formed as a parent/alumni advisory group with a strong interest in activities at Camp T. As educational support for segregated schools for the blind decreased, the State of Michigan became less interested in supporting activities at the camp. OUB then began organizing camping programs there for children who are blind or visually impaired, including hiring 50% of staff that were also blind or visually impaired. OUB CAMPS now works cooperatively with the Michigan Department of Education Low Incidence Outreach, the National Federation of the Blind of Michigan, Michigan Parents of Children with Visual Impairments, the Michigan Council of the Blind and Visually Impaired, the Bureau of Services to Blind Persons, and other organizations to produce high quality programming, stressing skills of blindness and independence for all attendees at our camps while having a great camp experience. OUB also operates travel camps off-site called "Camp-in-a-Box", which brings "camp" to kids in other areas of Michigan, "Birding-By-Ear" program, learning to identify birds by sound instead of by sight.

MISSION STATEMENT:

The mission of Opportunities Unlimited for the Blind is to enrich the quality of life of people who are blind and visually impaired thorough lifelong learning and recreation.

TOTAL ANNUAL BUDGET: \$171,072

NUMBER SERVED ANNUALLY: Estimated attendance for 2013 is 150 campers who are blind or visually impaired, and 20 sighted campers with interest in camps designed to increase awareness and understanding of persons who have vision or hearing loss or other disabilities.
